Ann Landers Selected 1969 'Woman of Year'

Ann Landers, whose advice column is the most widely syndicated in the world, has been judged "Woman of the Year" for 1969 by Sarah Coventry, Inc.

The award is made annually by the firm to an outstanding woman for her contribution to the community and concern for the welfare of others.

The silver cup, inscribed in recognition of her "dedicated service and counsel to the men and women of America," was presented to Miss Landers in Whicago Tuesday by Rex Wood, president of Sarah Coventry, Inc.

ark, New York, the world's largest direct selling jewelry firm, with activities in half-a-dozen countries, has long been active in civic affairs.

Miss Landers, who is Mrs. Jules Lederer in private life, has been giving advice via newspapers throughout the world, on personal problems to 34 million newspaper readers for the past 14 years.

She had never written a line for publication before the day, in 1955, when she walked into the offices of The Chicago Sun-Times and announced she would like to write an advice column because it "seemed like a very good way to help people."

Evidently help them she does, because she now receives more than 30,000 letters every month. A recent Gallup Poll listed her among the 20 women in the world most admired by Americans.

Her column has appeared regularly in the Press-Herald since she began writing it in 1955.
