Jewish People Mark Passover

The Passover Festival — which commemorates the deliverance of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt more than 3,400 years ago — is being celebrated for eight days by thousands of persons in the Greater Los Angeles area at observances provided by agencies of the Jewish Federation-Council and supported by its United Jewish Welfare Fund campaign.

As a remembrance of Jews in the Soviet Union, JFC's Committee on Soviet Jewry is circulating a poster protesting the oppression of Jewish religious life in the Soviet Union, which was announced by William H. Chotiner, chairman of the committee.

Passover packages containing prayer booklets and holiday food will be distributed to Jewish persons by Gateways Jewish Committee for Personal Service as part of their year-round visitation program for people in correctional institutions.


