

# Concert to Feature Young Musicians

## Youth Art Sale Slated Tonight

Five promising young musicians will be featured soloists tomorrow at 2 p.m. when the South Bay-Torrance Civic Symphony presents its youth concert at the Torrance Recreation Center.

Also performing at the Youth Concert will be the South Bay Junior Chamber Orchestra under the direction of Paula Gwinn. Before this season, the group was a string orchestra, but now includes other instruments.

ANOTHER group performing will be the Troubadours from Torrance High School. This group of more than 20 young singers is directed by David Norman.

A barber shop quartet from South High School, known as the Stroll-In Minstrels, will sing. Directed by Patricia Beyer, group members are Robert Baxter, Ronald Marzilli, Daniel Neece, and Daniel Wilson.

The Stroll-In Minstrels recently won first place in the Exchange Club talent contest.

The Youth Concert is part of a 2½ week festival of the arts presented by the symphony in conjunction with the Recreation Department. The symphony will present its Grand Concert May 15, with composer

## Bids Due For Unit Of Barrier

County supervisors have approved plans and specifications for construction of two units of the Dominguez Gap sea barrier project in the Wilmington area, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today.

Estimated total cost of the work has been set at about \$900,000.

Bids will be opened May 23 in the offices of the County Flood Control District. Award of contract by supervisors is due about 10 days later, Chace said.

THE JOB calls for construction of about four miles of water line to supply the anti-beine project plus pressure reduction and chlorination stations. Chace said the supply line begins in Alameda Street, some 200 feet south of Carson Street, runs southwest for about 6,100 feet to Dominguez Channel, southeast and south

along the channel for approximately 11,800 feet to the intersection of the channel and Grant Street, and west in Grant for about 3,040 feet to the end of the project at Blinn Avenue.

TWO DISPOSAL lines, for flushing wells used in the project, will be built with one starting at the intersection of Dominguez Channel and Grant Street and running west in Grant for approximately 1,524 feet. Another begins in Grant at Alameda Street and extends west to Blinn Avenue and south in Blinn to Cpp Street.

The pressure reducing station will be built at the beginning of the water supply pipeline near Carson and Alameda Streets while the chlorination station site is at Dominguez Channel and Sepulveda Boulevard, Chace said.

PLANS FOR the two units were prepared for the district by Long Beach consulting engineer M. A. Nishkian and Co. Object of the barrier program is to halt encroachment of sea water into fresh supplies near the ocean, Chace said.

Funds to finance the units have been included in the current fiscal year budget of the Flood Control District.

Work will start within 30 days after the contract award and take about 10 months to complete, Chace added.
