

Supervisor Sets Aside Trade Week

World trade is important to the tune of \$3 billion to Los Angeles County each year, and it's particularly important to the Fourth District.

In my district, three of the world's largest trade centers — Long Beach and Los Angeles harbor and International Airport — are the hub of this international activity.

THAT'S THE reason I sponsored a motion proclaiming World Trade Week this week, May 18-24. It is only proper that the county calls attention to the importance of world trade to our economy.

One of the newest features in this, the 43rd observance of World Trade Week, will be the International African-American Trade Show at the Consolidated Marine Terminal in San Pedro. The exhibit will open Tuesday and features products of African nations as well as African-American products manufactured locally.

Other exhibits are continuing county wide.

THE LOS ANGELES-Long Beach metropolitan area has become one of the world's most important markets, as well as its best test market. This is due to acceptance of new products on their merit without regard to their point of manufacture.

Retail sales were \$13 billion last year. Total imports and exports amounted to more than \$3 billion.

The same Los Angeles-Long Beach area is the hub of one of the most diversified industrial communities in the world. Southern California has 24,000 manufacturing plants turning out everything from motion pictures to orbiting satellites.

TINY FISH are now available in sufficient supply for the purpose of preventing the breeding of mosquitoes, according to the County Health Department. The fish, known as gambusia affinis, may be obtained by homeowners from several cooperating agencies.

Mosquitoes generally breed in ornamental ponds, pools or any other body of water usually existing on private property.


The Health Department pointed out mosquitoes need water to complete their life cycle. These insects lay eggs on the surface of the water, and the life cycle is carried out in this aquatic environment.

After a period of about 10 days or two weeks, the adult mosquitoes emerge and begin to search for a blood meal.

THE FISH destroy the mosquito wigglers as these newborn insects come to the surface to breathe. This is one of the most effective methods of controlling mosquitoes.

Carry a Litter Bag in Your Car, CHP Advises

It's a good idea to carry a litter bag in the automobile, especially now that picnic weather is here," Capt. W. R. Waldron, commander of the South Los Angeles area of the California Highway Patrol advises. Two sections of the California Vehicle Code prohibit throwing things on highways, he said. "Section 23112 prohibits throwing bottles, cans, garbage, glass, paper, or any subject likely to injure or damage traffic, or any offensive material of any kind, while Section 23111 prohibits throwing lighted cigarettes, cigars, ashes or other flame or glowing substances onto the highway. "These laws are enforced. But if drivers and passengers in vehicles use ash trays and keep other litter in a bag we'll have nothing to enforce, and that will suit us just fine." The CHP commander also noted that citizens can assist in enforcing Section 23111 by reporting to the Department of Motor Vehicles the license number of any motor vehicle from which they see flaming or glowing substances thrown.

The Department of Motor Vehicles will pass this information, together with the name of the registered owner of the vehicle, to the State Division of Forestry, who will take appropriate action against the violator.
